

<b>Fire Danger Level Legend</b>	
<b>Status</b>	<b>Description</b>
<b>Low</b>	Fires likely to be self-extinguishing and new ignitions unlikely. Any existing fires limited to smoldering in deep, drier layers.
<b>Moderate</b>	Creeping or gentle surface fires. Fires easily contained by ground crews with pumps and hand tools.
<b>High</b>	Moderate to vigorous surface fire with intermittent crown involvement. Challenging for ground crews to handle; heavy equipment (bulldozers, tanker trucks, aircraft) often required to contain fire.
<b>Very High</b>	High-intensity fire with partial to full crown involvement. Head fire conditions beyond the ability of ground crews; air attack with retardant required to effectively attack fire's head.
<b>Extreme</b>	Fast-spreading, high-intensity crown fire. Very difficult to control. Suppression actions limited to flanks, with only indirect actions possible against the fire's head.
<b>Nil</b>	No calculations were performed for this region.
