



Adopt- A- Flowerbed Garden Program

Program Overview and Goals:

The Municipality of South Dundas Adopt-A-Flowerbed is a volunteer program designed for interested individuals, groups, and businesses to adopt a street side or public flowerbed. The goal of the project is to provide adopters with an active role in the community by maintaining and improving gardens, as well as providing a way to grow pride in the community and make the Municipality a welcoming and beautiful place for residents and tourists. The program works with volunteers to ensure that many costs associated with flowerbeds are covered by the Municipality.

Adoption Process:

South Dundas residents, clubs, organizations, and businesses are eligible to adopt a flowerbed through the Adopt-A-Flowerbed program. Note: for participants under the age of 18, consent from a parent or guardian is required.

Each spring, upon staff review, adopters from the previous year will be invited to continue their adoption with the same flowerbed. This program seeks to have one garden per adopter. If multiple flowerbeds wish to be adopted by one resident, club, organization, or business, municipal staff may make an exception based on the flower bed size and location.

Those who are interested in adopting a flowerbed must fill out the application form provided. The Municipality will adopt flowerbeds on a first come first served basis. If a specific flowerbed sees more than one request, a waiting list will be created, and participants will be contacted if/when it becomes available, or the participants will be given the option to work as team.

Adopters will work with municipal staff each spring to ensure they have the tools, plants, and supplies required to complete the planting for the year. The adopters will provide staff with either a list of requested supplies or coordinate a shopping trip with staff.

Adopters are responsible for their flowerbed for the entire season. This includes regular maintenance such as watering, weeding, and litter pickup. Adopters will be notified when more attention is required to their flowerbed. Any alterations to the flowerbed must be approved by the municipality.



Providing water to the flowerbed may be an adopter's biggest challenge. In the absence of irrigation or hose bibs, adopters will need to plan a way to water their flowerbed during dry periods.

The use of chemical fertilizers, herbicides and pesticides are strictly prohibited.

Volunteer Hours:

The municipality will fulfill any volunteer involvement reports for students to earn their hours to acquire their Ontario Secondary School Diploma.

Donation and Sponsorships:

To help grow this program, opportunities for donations of plants, materials and/or monetary amounts may be available. Plants and materials are desired. At this time advertisement at the gardens is not available. Should sufficient demand for advertising arise, the municipality will review the possibility of sponsorships with advertisement.



Alteration and New Gardens:

The goal of the program is to have all the existing gardens adopted prior to the creation of any new garden areas or significant expansion to the existing ones. However, the municipality is open to adopters being creative and improving their garden, only to make sure that alterations are appropriate for a specific garden.



If there is an opportunity to create a new garden area or expand an existing garden, it is hoped that the creator would also be or have available an adopter for the new garden. Anyone who is interested in creating a new garden must submit a drawing of the proposed garden outlining the location, size, plantings, materials, and the costs for all the above. The municipality will review the information and determine whether the proposed new garden is a suitable addition to the program and review the available funding to ensure that it fits within the means of the municipality. If the new garden or expansion is granted the municipality will work with the adopter to implement the changes.

Iroquois Waterfront North Flowerbed	Approximately 41 Elizabeth Drive	<p>This flowerbed is located on the north side of the Iroquois Waterfront. The bed is currently home to a few shrubs and perennials, however, has space to provide additional annual flowers at an adopters discretion.</p> <p>ADOPTED</p>	
Iroquois Beach Flowerbed	Iroquois Beach 51 Adair Drive	<p>This floor bed is located at the Iroquois Beach Building and one of the most seen and visible Municipal Flower Beds. There is a mix of annuals and perennials in this bed.</p> <p>ADOPTED</p>	





<p>Iroquois Plaza Bouy Flowerbed</p>	<p>Miller St & County Road 2</p>	<p>The Iroquois Plaza flowerbed is located between the buoys at the Iroquois Plaza Greenspace. The bed is home to many shrubs and perennials however, is a highly visible spot that could benefit from additional annuals and colours.</p> <p>ADOPTED</p>	
<p>Iroquois Locks/Carman Road</p>	<p>Corner of Hadley Street and Carman Road</p>	<p>This flowerbed has been abandoned but with your help could be a new blank canvas to work on. The flowerbed area is relatively small but is visible to all the visitor to the Iroquois Locks.</p> <p>ADOPTED</p>	




<p>Iroquois Civic Center Flowerbeds</p>	<p>1 Dundas Street</p>	<p>There are two sections of flowerbeds at the Iroquois Civic Center. The south side receives a lot of sun.</p> <p>The north side is home to the Iroquois Cenotaph with a newly installed flowerbed which is home to many perennials however, there is some space for creativity and some tasteful annuals.</p> <p>ADOPTED</p>	
<p>Dundas County Archives</p>	<p>5 College Street</p>	<p>At the Archives there are two small plots in the front of the facility both have shrubs which could be trimmed to allow the installation of some smaller flowers below.</p> <p>ADOPTED</p>

Dog Park Flowerbed	85 Cruickshank Way	<p>There is a small flowerbed at the ever-popular Morrisburg Dog Park. The plants here will need to be hardy and tough with all their four-legged visitors.</p> <p>However, it is a great opportunity to beautify a busy park in the Municipality.</p> <p>ADOPTED</p>	
Morrisburg Boat Launch Flowerbed	1 Lakeshore Drive	<p>Anyone arriving at the Morrisburg Boat Launch or enjoying an ice cream from the Docksyde will see this small bed at the entrance to the dock. There are some existing perennials however, there is space for annuals.</p> <p>ADOPTED</p>	



<p>Justice Building Flowerbeds</p>	<p>6 Fifth Street</p>	<p>There are existing flowerbeds on the North and South side of the facility an adopters can choose to do one or both.</p> <p>The Gardens are overgrown however, the Municipality can help to remove some of the shrubs/milkweed to match the adopters vision.</p> <p>ADOPTED</p>

<p>Earl Baker Park Flowerbed</p>	<p>Corner of Sir James Morris and Park Ave</p>	<p>There are approximately 4 or 5 flowerbeds and shrubs as can be seen in the photos below.</p> <p>Adopters can choose to adopt all or just one of the flowerbeds. <p>South Dundas Municipal Center</p>	<p>34 Ottawa Street</p>	<p>There is a small flower bed that is slightly overgrown with perennials and shrubs at the flagpoles at the Municipal Office.</p> <p>An adopter may remove some of the shrubs and make the flowerbed their own.</p> <p>ADOPTED</p>	
<p>Morrisburg Waterfront Shoreline Natural Edge</p>	<p>Morrisburg Waterfront/Bea ch</p>	<p>The shoreline project is working on introducing native wildflowers along the shoreline which can help to protect the shoreline, reduce geese traffic, and improve wildlife at the waterfront. The shoreline planting does require some maintenance during establishment this includes weeding to ensure that the wildflowers can grow and propagate.</p> <p>AVAILABLE</p>

<p>Matilda Hall Cenotaph</p>	<p>4421 County Road 16</p>	<p>The Matilda Hall Cenotaph has a natural garden installed around it with lots of grasses and shrubs making up most of the area. However, there is some space and space can be made for tasteful flowers to be installed.</p> <p>ADOPTED</p>	
<p>Riverside Heights Flowerbed</p>	<p>13137 Riverside Drive</p>	<p>Along the front of the Hall there is a small south facing flowered bed. There are some perennials and shrubs within the existing bed which can be removed or modified to match the adopter's vision.</p> <p>ADOPTED</p>
